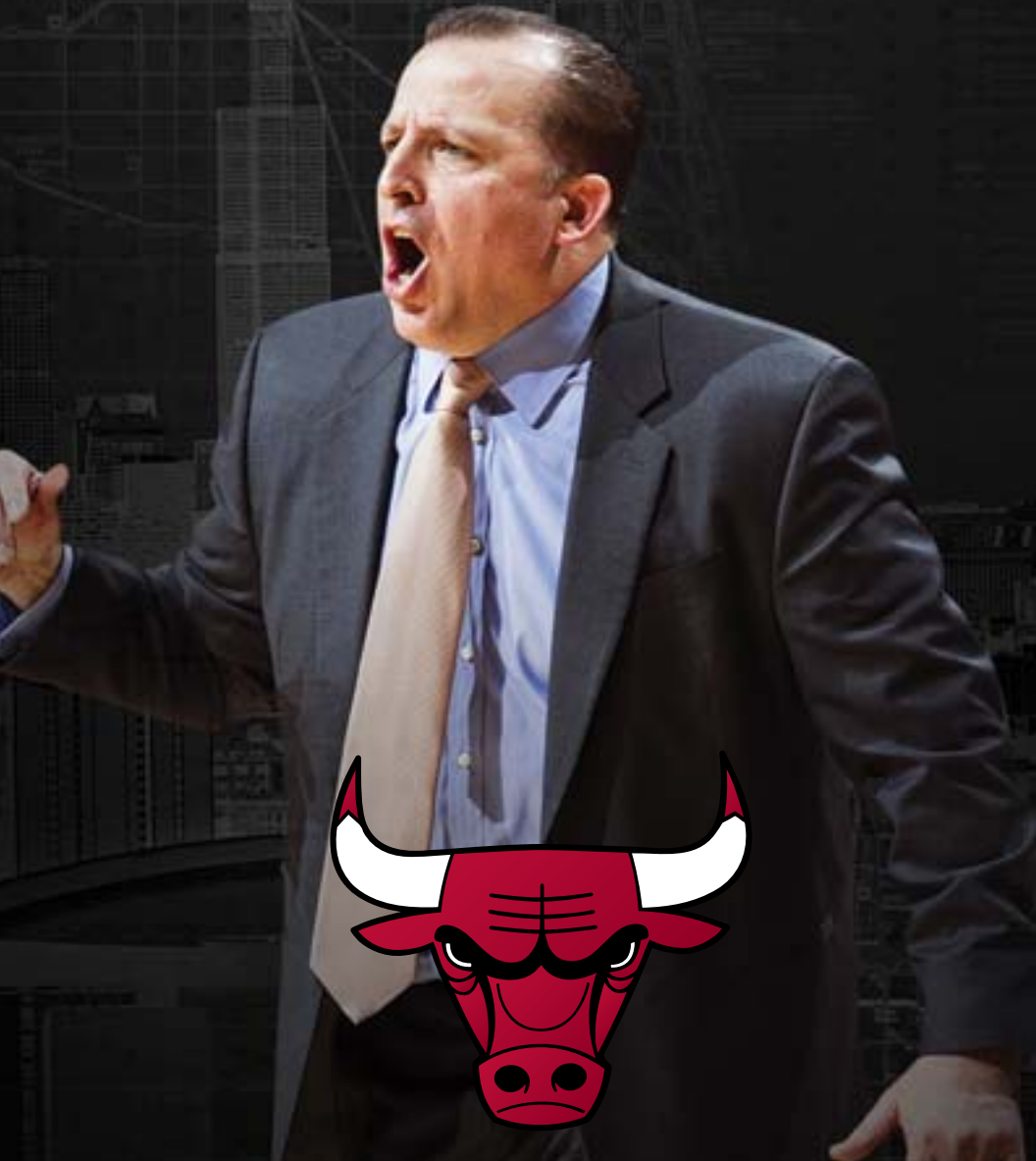

JOHN PAXSON

EXECUTIVE V.P. - BASKETBALL OPERATIONS

Paxson remains at the forefront of the organization in his role as Executive Vice President of Basketball Operations and works in tandem with General Manager Gar Forman in an effort to bring an NBA Championship back to Chicago ... Paxson has been a part of the organization as a player, coach, broadcaster or front office executive since 1985 ... Paxson is the sixth individual to head basketball operations in the history of the Chicago Bulls, joining Dick Klein (1966-69), Pat Williams (1969-73), Dick Motta (1973-76), Rod Thorn (1978-85) and Jerry Krause (1985-2003) ... Paxson has positively implemented change upon the Bulls roster, coaching staff and basketball operations department, with the Bulls making playoff appearances in seven of his nine years as head of basketball operations (2005-07, 2009-2012) ... in 2004-05, the Bulls won 47 games (a

24-game improvement from the previous season) with 13 of his player acquisitions leading the way ... in overseeing five NBA Drafts (the Bulls were without a pick in 2005), Paxson selected four NBA First-Team All-Rookie selections ... in 2003, with his first draft pick, he selected Kansas guard Kirk Hinrich with the seventh selection—Hinrich was selected to the All-Rookie First Team ... in 2004, at the helm for his second draft, Paxson chose Connecticut guard Ben Gordon third overall and traded for the draft rights to Duke forward Luol Deng, selected seventh overall ... in Gordon's rookie season he was named NBA Sixth Man of the Year and Deng joined Gordon on the NBA All-Rookie First Team ... Paxson drafted Memphis guard Derrick Rose with the first overall pick in the 2008 NBA Draft, Rose went on to be named 2009 NBA Rookie of the Year, as well as named to the NBA All-Rookie First Team ... also active on the free agent front, Paxson signed Spanish League star Andrés Nocioni prior to the 2004-05 season and watched the Argentina native significantly bolster the Bulls' frontline ... Paxson has also proven an adept player in the free agent market, signing four-time All-Star and four-time NBA Defensive Player of the Year Ben Wallace in the summer of 2006 ... John spent seven seasons as a color analyst on both the Bulls' radio and television networks, providing expert analysis to Bulls' broadcasts ... spent one season (1995-96) as an assistant coach, helping the Bulls to an NBA-record 72-10 mark and the 1996 NBA World Championship ... Paxson spent nine of his 11 NBA seasons as a player with Chicago, helping the Bulls to three consecutive NBA World Championships (1991, 1992, 1993) ... Paxson was also responsible for one of the most memorable shots in NBA history during the 1993 NBA Finals, sinking a game-and-series-winning three-pointer with 0:3.9 seconds remaining to defeat the Phoenix Suns on the road in Game 6, giving the Bulls their third straight NBA World Championship ... his NBA career began after being selected by the San Antonio Spurs in the first round (19th overall) of the 1983 NBA Draft ... he became a Bull after signing as a free agent on Oct. 30, 1985 ... a 1983 graduate of the University of Notre Dame ... John's father Jim, played two seasons in the NBA during the 1950's (1956-58) ... John and his wife, Carolyn, reside in Lake Bluff, Ill., and have two sons, Ryan and Drew.

GAR FORMAN GENERAL MANAGER

Entering his 15th season with the Chicago Bulls and fourth as General Manager, Gar Forman has the team positioned for success in the present and into the future through a combination of careful planning and constant evaluation of staff and personnel from player to administrative levels ... Forman oversees all basketball-related matters, including personnel, coaching, scouting, player development, medical staff, strength/athletic training and administrative staff ... Forman headed a plan to build and develop a base of talent through carefully researched draft selections and to augment that core through trades and free agency, while sticking to the long-held organizational emphasis on defense and character has resulted in the best record in the NBA the past two consecutive seasons, four straight post-season appearances, and advancing to the Eastern Conference Finals in 2010-11 ... awarded the 2011 NBA Executive of the Year (along with Miami's Pat Riley) following a season which saw the Bulls catapult from a 41-win team to a league-best 62-20

following a dizzying array of transactions heading into the 2010-11 campaign ... Forman named eventual 2011 NBA Coach of the Year Tom Thibodeau to Thibodeau's first head coaching position on June 23, 2010 following a detailed and expansive search ... named GM in May of 2009, Forman oversaw his first draft in the GM chair in June of 2009 ... with the 26th pick, he plucked eventual First Team All-Rookie selection Taj Gibson from USC ... prior to being elevated to his current post, Forman spent 10 years in various capacities with the Bulls, including five seasons as Director of Player Personnel under Executive Vice President John Paxson ... as Paxson's trusted advisor, Forman provided a structured information-gathering system which hailed an eventual MVP and member of the First Team All-NBA (Derrick Rose), six members of the NBA All-Rookie Team, a Rookie of the Year (Rose), two members of the All-Defense team (Kirk Hinrich and Thabo Sefolosha) and a Sixth Man of the Year (Ben Gordon) ... Forman began his career with the Bulls in 1998, as a Scout before being elevated to Special Assistant to the Executive Vice President of Basketball Operations in 2002 ... prior to the Bulls, Forman was an assistant coach/recruiting coordinator at Iowa State from 1994-98, helping lead the Cyclones to the 1996 Big Eight Championship, three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and three Top 25 finishes ... prior to Iowa State, he was assistant coach/recruiting coordinator from 1988-94 at New Mexico State, where the team went to five straight NCAA Tournaments, including the Sweet Sixteen in 1992 and earned five consecutive Top 25 finishes ... during that time, NMSU won four Big West Conference Championships, posted a 123-35 overall record and finished as high as 11th in the nation (1991) ... he was assistant coach/recruiting coordinator at Cal Poly Pomona in 1987-88 ... he was an in-house assistant coach at New Mexico State University from 1985-87 ... his first head coaching position was at the College of the Desert (Palm Desert, Calif.) from 1983-85, leading the team to consecutive 20-win seasons and to a school record 13 conference wins in 1984-85 ... he was an assistant coach at the College of the Desert in 1982-83 ... his first coaching position was at his alma mater, Utah State University, as a graduate assistant/JV coach in 1981-82 ... he received his B.A. degree in Marketing and Education in 1982 from Utah State ... Gar and his wife, Leslie, Vice President of Chicago Bulls Charities, reside in the northern suburbs with their sons, Braeden and Jaxsen.

TOM THIBODEAU HEAD COACH

A veteran of 21 years along the NBA sidelines, Tom Thibodeau (pronounced Thib-uh-DOE) was named the 18th head coach in franchise history on June 23, 2010 ... is the only coach in NBA history to win the most games in the league each of his first two seasons ... finished as runner-up to Gregg Popovich for the 2011-12 NBA Coach of the Year award ... enters the 2012-13 season with a career record of 112-36 and has a career winning percentage of .757, which ranks first in NBA history ... in his second year with the Bulls, Chicago posted a league-best record of 50-16 (.758), including a league-best road record of 24-9 (.727), en route to a second consecutive Central Division crown ... broke the NBA record for reaching the 100-win plateau the fastest by winning his 100th game in his 130th contest as a head coach (03/19/12) ... in 2011-12, Chicago set a franchise record by allowing just 88.2 ppg (the fewest points allowed in the NBA since 2004) ... Chicago also ranked first in the NBA in points allowed, first in scoring margin (+8.1), first in rebound

margin (a franchise record 6.7), first in rebounds per game (46.7) and offensive boards per game (13.9), and second in opponent field goal percentage (.421) ... the Bulls ranked second in defensive efficiency at .975 points per possession and fifth in offensive efficiency at 1.062 points per possession in 2011-12 ... he and his coaching staff coached Derrick Rose, Luol Deng and the rest of the Eastern Conference All-Stars at the 2012 All-Star Game in Orlando ... from Feb. 9, 2011-April 1, 2012, the Bulls did not lose consecutive games, a span of 86 games without a losing streak of two straight games (the second-longest streak of its kind in NBA history) ... he was named Eastern Conference Coach of the Month for Dec./Jan. 2012 (18-5) and March 2012 (13-3) ... in his first season as head coach, Thibodeau guided the Bulls to the Eastern Conference Finals, the team's first appearance in the Conference Finals since the 1997-98 season ... the Bulls also won the Central Division title, en route to the franchise's sixth 60-win season in team history with a record of 62-20 (.756) ... his 62 wins in 2010-11 broke Phil Jackson's franchise mark (55 in 1989-90) for most wins by a first-year Bulls head coach ... he is just one of three coaches (along with Paul Westphal and Bill Russell) in NBA history to win 60 or more games in his first year as a head coach, and his 62 victories ties Westphal for the most wins by a first-year head coach in league history ... was named the 2010-11 NBA Coach of the Year ... he was named NBA Eastern Conference Coach of the Month on three occasions (January 12-4, March 13-3 and April 8-0) ... he is the first Bulls head coach to win the award three times in a season ... Chicago finished the 2010-11 regular season with the best record in the NBA, and also claimed the top seed in the Eastern Conference ... his 62 wins in his first season with the Bulls marked a 21-game improvement from the team's record of 41-41 in 2009-10, the third-best single-season turnaround in team history ... Chicago went 36-5 (.878) at the United Center, good for the best home record in the NBA ... during the 2010-11 season, Chicago was 16-4 following a loss ... the Bulls posted an NBA-best record of 27-10 (.730) against teams with a winning record ... in his first season with the Bulls, Chicago finished the year ranked first in the NBA in opponent field goal percentage (.430), first in opponent three-point field goal percentage (.326), first in opponent rebounds per game (38.4), first in rebound margin (plus-5.7), second in point differential (plus-7.3), second in opponent points per game (91.3), second in opponent assists per game (19.0), second in the NBA in rebounds per game (44.2) and fifth in blocks per game (5.71) ... Chicago also ranked first in defensive efficiency at .995 points per possession and 11th in offensive efficiency at 1.072 in 2010-11 ... Thibodeau served as the Associate Head Coach of the Boston Celtics from 2007-10, where the Celtics made two trips to the NBA Finals and won the 2008 NBA Championship ... prior to joining the Bulls, his teams won .530 of their games (896-794) in the regular season and .527 of their postseason contests (88-79) ... including his two years in Chicago, his teams have advanced to the NBA postseason 16 times, including three trips to the NBA Finals (1999, 2008 and 2010) ... he implemented and oversaw Boston's defensive principles during his time on Doc Rivers' staff ... in 2007-08, his first year with the Celtics, Boston held its opponents to 90.3 ppg, an improvement of 8.9 ppg from the previous season, and limited its foes to an NBA-low .419 field goal shooting, down from .468 the year before ... during Boston's 2008 playoff run that culminated in the franchise's NBA-record 17th world championship, the Celtics held the Los Angeles Lakers to 93.8 ppg and .441 field-goal shooting in the NBA Finals (L.A. averaged 102.4 ppg and shot .468 from the field in the 2008 playoffs) ... he has helped his teams rank in the NBA's top 10 in team defense 19 times, including finishing in the top two in opponent field goal percentage 13 times ... his teams have ranked in the top two in opponent scoring nine times ... he has also coached for the Minnesota Timberwolves (1989-91), the San Antonio Spurs (1992-94), the Philadelphia 76ers (1994-96), the New York Knicks (1996-2003) and the Houston Rockets (2003-07) ... he spent the 1991-92 season as an advance scout with the Seattle SuperSonics ... while serving as an assistant coach in the NBA, he worked under Bill Musselman, Jerry Tarkanian, John Lucas, Jeff Van Gundy, Don Chaney and Doc Rivers ... in 2000-01 with New York, the Knicks established a then-NBA record when they held 33 consecutive opponents to under 100 points ... he was a four-year letter winner in basketball at Salem State University (Salem, Mass.) ... he was team captain his senior season, and a member of back-to-back MASCAC Conference Champion squads in 1980 and 1981 (the first two basketball teams in school history to qualify for the Division III NCAA Tournament) ... in 1981, upon completion of his collegiate career, he took his first coaching job as an assistant on the Vikings staff ... following three years as an assistant, he was promoted to head coach at Salem State University, a position he held for one season ... in 1985, he was hired as an assistant coach at Harvard University, where he spent four seasons on campus, before accepting a spot on Bill Musselman's coaching staff with the expansion Minnesota Timberwolves in 1989 ... Thibodeau, 54, was born in New Britain, Conn., on Jan. 17, 1958 ... he holds bachelor's and master's degrees in Counseling from Salem State University ... he was inducted into the New Britain Sports Hall of Fame in 1998.



RON ADAMS ASSISTANT COACH

Adams is in his second stint with the Bulls after spending two seasons with the Oklahoma City Thunder (2008-10) ... prior to joining the Thunder, Adams spent six seasons with the Bulls as an assistant coach (2003-08) and as a special assignments scout (2008) ... while as an assistant, Adams helped guide the Bulls to three consecutive playoff appearances (2004-07) ... Adams has also held assistant coaching stints with the Milwaukee Bucks (1998-03), San Antonio Spurs (1992-94) and the Philadelphia 76ers (1994-96) ... he has served as a player personnel scout for the Portland Trail Blazers (1996-98) ... prior to his work in the NBA, Adams coached at the collegiate level as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Fresno Pacific University in 1969 and was promoted to head coach in 1972 ... he also served assistant coaching stints at U.S. International, University of Cal-Santa Barbara, Fresno State University and University of Nevada-Las Vegas ... he was head coach at Fresno State during a second tour of duty from 1986-90 ... he has coached professional basketball in Belgium, consulted and coached with the Canadian National basketball program and two Japanese professional basketball clubs, as well as the Belgian Basketball Federation ... he graduated with a degree in History and Political Science from Fresno Pacific University in 1969 and received a master's degree in Physical Education from Fresno State in 1974 ... Ron and his wife Leah, have two children, Jerid and Hayley.



ANDY GREER ASSISTANT COACH

Greer is in his third season as assistant coach for the Chicago Bulls ... prior to joining the Bulls, Greer was a scout for the Portland Trail Blazers primarily responsible for evaluating talent for trades and free agency ... he has held three different assistant coaching positions in the NBA, most recently with the Memphis Grizzlies (2007-09), as a member of Marc Iavaroni's staff ... prior to his time with the Grizzlies, Greer spent four seasons with the Houston Rockets (2003-07) under Jeff Van Gundy and two seasons with the New York Knicks (2001-03) under head coach Don Chaney ... in addition to his NBA experience, Greer has coached at the collegiate level for nearly two decades ... he spent four years as head coach at the United States Merchant Marine Academy ... Greer also spent four years at Northern Illinois University, where he logged three-and-a-half seasons as an assistant coach and a half-season as the team's interim head coach ... Greer received his first coaching job as an assistant coach at Genesee Community College in 1983 ... he has also coached collegiately at Mansfield University, Brandeis University, Boston University and the University of Southern California ... Greer holds a bachelor of science degree in Physical Education from SUNY-Brockport and a master's degree in Education from Mansfield University ... his younger brother, Larry, is an assistant basketball coach with Arizona State University ... Greer and his wife Lesley, have a son Zachary, and two daughters, Haley and Blake.



ADRIAN GRIFFIN ASSISTANT COACH

Griffin begins his third season as assistant coach for the Chicago Bulls ... prior to joining the Bulls coaching staff, he spent two seasons as an assistant coach/player development with the Milwaukee Bucks ... Griffin enjoyed a nine-year NBA career that included stops in Boston (1999-01), Dallas (2001-03, 2005-06), Houston (2003-04), Chicago (2004-05, 2006-08) and Seattle (2007-08) ... undrafted out of Seton Hall, Griffin played one season in Italy and three seasons in the CBA and was named league MVP, and Finals MVP, while playing with CBA champion Connecticut Pride in 1998-99 ... the Wichita, Kan., native advanced to the postseason in five of his nine seasons in the NBA ... Griffin and his wife Audrey, have two daughters, Vanessa and Aubrey, and two sons, Alan and Adrian, Jr.



ED PINCKNEY ASSISTANT COACH

Pinckney is in his third season as an assistant coach on Tom Thibodeau's staff ... was head coach of the Egyptian National Team and an assistant coach on the Ukrainian National staff under Mike Fratello (2011) ... prior to joining the Bulls coaching staff, he was the television analyst for the Philadelphia 76ers ... Pinckney spent two seasons as an assistant coach for the Minnesota Timberwolves (2007-2009) ... he spent four seasons as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Villanova University (2003-2007) ... he also served as a member of the Miami Heat radio and television and broadcasting team after his retirement from basketball in 1997 ... a first-round draft choice of the Phoenix Suns in 1985, Pinckney spent 12 seasons in the NBA with Phoenix, Sacramento, Boston, Milwaukee, Toronto, Philadelphia and Miami ... as a collegian, he was one of the greatest players in Villanova history, helping lead the Wildcats to the 1985 NCAA National Championship over Georgetown and was named Most Outstanding Player of the Final Four ... Ed and his wife Rose, have three sons, Shae, Spencer, and Austin and a daughter, Andrea.



MIKE WILHELM ASSISTANT COACH

Mike is currently in his eleventh season with the Chicago Bulls as an assistant coach and his 19th year overall in the NBA ... prior to joining the Bulls, Wilhelm spent the 2001-02 season as a regional advance scout for the Denver Nuggets ... first entered the NBA with the Cleveland Cavaliers on Mike Fratello's staff during the 1993-94 season, where he served as the team's assistant video coordinator ... Wilhelm became the head video coordinator in 1996, a position he held until 1999 when he became the team's advance scout on Randy Wittman's staff ... during that time, he also served as assistant coach for the WNBA's Cleveland Rockers from 1997 through the 1999 season, winning the Eastern Conference Championship with the Rockers in 1998 ... his coaching career began in Sweden's professional league, where he directed the Sundsvall Dragons for two seasons from 1990-92 ... worked the NBA's Basketball Without Borders in China in 2006 ... played basketball at Southampton College in Long Island from 1986 through 1990 ... was captain of the team in both his junior and senior seasons ... graduated with a degree in history ... received a master's degree in Sports Administration from Ohio University in 1993 ... In her position as Mr. Reinsdorf's assistant, Sheri had the opportunity to touch and brighten the lives of countless people from fans to heads of state. Her wonderful sense of humor and ability to bring joy to any situation were immediately missed even more than her considerable professional skills.

During the remainder of the 1991-92 season, the team wore black patches on their jerseys in memory of Sheri. When the new training facility opened in September 1992, it was named The Sheri L. Berto Center and dedicated to her memory. The building continues to serve as a tribute to the countless contributions Sheri made to the Bulls, their fans and the community, as she is still greatly missed by all who had the pleasure of meeting her.
