JUNE, 2011

June 23, 2011 - Drafted Norris Cole (28th overall), Jimmy Butler (30th) and Malcolm Lee (43rd) in the 2011 NBA Draft.

June 23, 2011 - Acquired the draft rights to the No. 23 pick Nikola Mirotic from Minnesota in exchange for the draft rights to the No. 28 pick Norris Cole, No. 43 pick Malcolm Lee and cash considerations.

June 29, 2011 - Exercised the fourth-year option on Taj Gibson.

DECEMBER, 2011

Dec. 9, 2011 - Signed rookie Jimmy Butler

Dec. 12, 2011 - Re-signed Brian Scalabrine.

Dec. 14, 2011 - Signed free agent Richard Hamilton.

Dec. 16, 2011 - Waived guards Keith Bogans and Jannerro Pargo.

Dec. 21, 2011 - Signed Derrick Rose to a multi-year contract extension.

Dec. 25, 2011 - Chicago opened the 2011-12 season on the road in a Christmas Day matchup against the Los Angeles Lakers. The Bulls were down 87-81 with just under a minute to play. With :16.9 left in regulation, Luol Deng stole a pass from Kobe Bryant with Chicago down one point, Derrick Rose then sealed the victory for the Bulls by hitting a running hook shot with :04.8 left in the game. Both Rose (22 points and five assists) and Deng (21 points and seven rebounds) led the way for Chicago. Kobe Bryant posted a game-high 28 points for the Lakers.

Dec. 29, 2011 - Chicago claimed its second road win of the season with a 108-98 win at Sacramento. Five Bulls players scored in double-figures, led by Carlos Boozer's double-double with 16 points and 15 rebounds. Chicago shot .538 from the field and dished out 25 assists to the Kings 13 assists.

Dec. 30, 2011 - Chicago ended its four-game road trip with a win over the L.A. Clippers, 114-101. All five starters notched double-figures in scoring, led by Derrick Rose's 29 points and 16 assists. The Bulls outrebounded the Clippers 45-31. Blake Griffin scored a game-high 34 points and grabbed 13 rebounds for the Clippers.

JANUARY, 2012

Jan. 1, 2012 - Chicago opened the home portion of its season with a 104-64 victory over the Memphis Grizzlies. The Bulls held the Grizzlies to .310 shooting from the field, .111 from downtown and outrebounded Memphis 55-40. Ronnie Brewer led the way for Chicago posting 17 points, seven rebounds and five assists. Carlos Boozer tallied his second double-double of the season with 17 points and 11 boards.

Jan. 3, 2012 - Both Derrick Rose (30 points and seven assists) and Luol Deng (21 points and eight rebounds) led Chicago to a comeback victory over the Atlanta Hawks, 76-74. Chicago outscored Atlanta 34-18 in the fourth quarter, after being outscored 56-42 in the first three quarters. With the win, Chicago recorded its fourth straight victory.

Jan. 6, 2012 - The Bulls captured their sixth straight victory with a 97-83 win over the Orlando Magic. Derrick Rose (21 points), Luol Deng (21 points) and Carlos Boozer (20 points) all posted 20-point games for Chicago. The Bulls shot .571 from downtown and dished out 27 assists on the night.

Jan. 9, 2012 - The Bulls downed the Detroit Pistons 92-68 at the United Center. Carlos Boozer had high-scoring honors with 23 points and eight rebounds, while Derrick Rose added 22 points and eight assists. Chicago held Detroit to nine points in the fourth quarter (outscored them 24-9) and outscored them in fast break points 18-6.

JANUARY, 2012 (CONT.)

Jan. 10, 2012 - Chicago won its sixth road game of the season defeating Minnesota, 111-100. Derrick Rose scored a game-high 31 points to go along with his 11 assists, while Luol Deng added a double-double with 21 points and 11 rebounds. The Bulls shot .531 from the field and .550 from the three-point line.

Jan. 11, 2012 - Signed free agent Mike James.

Jan. 11, 2012 - The Bulls completed their back-to-back-to-back set with a 78-64 win over the Washington Wizards. In his first career NBA start, John Lucas scored a game-high 25 points to go along with his eight assists and eight boards. Chicago outrebounded Washington 62-46 in the win.

Jan. 13, 2012 - Chicago notched its fourth straight win with a 88-79 victory over the Boston Celtics. All five of Chicago's starters reached double-figures in scoring, led by Derrick Rose's 25 points and seven assists. The Bulls outscored the Celtics in points in the paint (38-34) and second-chance points (24-14).

Jan. 16, 2012 - Derrick Rose was named Eastern Conference Player of the Week (Jan. 9 - Jan. 15).

Jan. 17, 2012 - Carlos Boozer posted a game-high 31 points in Chicago's 118-97 win over the Phoenix Suns. The Bulls posted season highs for points in a quarter (39, first) and points in a half (67, first). C.J. Watson notched 23 points, five assists and four rebounds, while Joakim Noah tallied a double-double with 13 points and 12 rebounds. The win marked Chicago's fifth home win of the season.

Jan. 23, 2012 - Chicago recorded its ninth win in 10 games by defeating the New Jersey Nets at the United Center, 110-95. Richard Hamilton posted 22 points and 10 assists, while Derrick Rose also scored 22 points and dished out eight assists. The Bulls tallied a season-high 33 assists and outrebounded the Nets 43-32.

Jan. 27, 2012 - Derrick Rose scored a game-high 34 points, while both Carlos Boozer (20 points and 13 rebounds) and Joakim Noah (15 points and 16 rebounds) recorded double-doubles in Chicago's 107-100 win over the Milwaukee Bucks. With the win, Chicago improved its record to 17-4 on the season.

Jan. 28, 2012 - Waived Mike James.

FEBRUARY, 2012

Feb. 1, 2012 - Head Coach Tom Thibodeau was named Eastern Conference Coach of the Month for December/January.

Feb. 2, 2012 - Derrick Rose carried the Bulls to a 105-102 win over the Knicks at Madison Square Garden. Rose posted 32 points and dished out 13 assists, while C.J. Watson scored 12 points off the bench for Chicago. The Bulls outscored the Knicks' bench 25-6 and shot .527 from the field on the night. Carlos Boozer and Kyle Korver both scored 16 points for Chicago.

Feb. 4, 2012 - The Bulls held the Bucks to .398 shooting from the field and .083 from downtown in their 113-90 win over Milwaukee at the Bradley Center. Derrick Rose led the way for Chicago posting 26 points, 13 assists and seven rebounds, while Luol Deng added 21 points and nine rebounds. Chicago outscored Milwaukee 67-43 in the first half and outrebounded the Bucks 53-39.

Feb. 8, 2012 - Chicago blew out New Orleans 90-67 for its 13th road win of the season. 10 of the Bulls 12 players who saw action recorded one or more field goals on the night. Carlos Boozer posted 18 points and six rebounds, while Joakim Noah recorded a double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds.



FEBRUARY, 2012

Feb. 10, 2012 – For the second game in a row Chicago defeated an opponent by at least 20 points, beating the Charlotte Bobcats 95-64. Chicago outrebounded Charlotte 53-44 and outscored the Bobcats 79-51 in the first three quarters. Joakim Noah notched a double-double with 17 points and 14 rebounds, while Omer Asik added 12 boards off the bench for Chicago.

Feb. 14, 2012 – Signed Mike James.

Feb. 14, 2012 – Luol Deng nearly notched a triple-double with 23 points, 11 assists and seven rebounds, as Chicago defeated Sacramento 121-115 to sweep the season series with the Kings. The Bulls dished out a season-high 33 assists and their 121 points also marked a season high. With the victory, Chicago moved to 24-7 on the season.

Feb. 16, 2012 – Carlos Boozer (23 points and 15 rebounds) and Luol Deng (23 points and 10 assists) both propelled the Bulls to a 89-80 victory over the Boston Celtics at the United Center. Joakim Noah also posted a double-double with 15 points and 16 rebounds, while as a team the Bulls grabbed 52 rebounds and dished out 27 assists on the night.

Feb. 22, 2012 – Joakim Noah recorded his first career triple-double with 13 points, 13 rebounds and 10 assists in a 110-91 win over the Milwaukee Bucks. All five of Chicago's starters scored 10 or more points, with Chicago shooting .544 from field. The Bulls outrebounded the Bucks 49-29 and dished out 32 assists on the night.

Feb. 26, 2012 – Derrick Rose and Luol Deng were selected to play in the 2012 NBA All-Star Game in Orlando. It marked the first time since 1997 that Chicago had two players (Michael Jordan and Scottie Pippen) participate in the All-Star Game. It was Rose's third-straight All-Star nod (second as a starter), while it marked Deng's first All-Star Game appearance. Head Coach Tom Thibodeau and his staff coached the Eastern Conference All-Stars, while Assistant Coach Ron Adams coached the TEAM SHAQ squad in the Rising Stars Challenge.

Feb. 29, 2012 – The Bulls won their fourth in a row with a 96-89 road win over the San Antonio Spurs. Derrick Rose led all scorers with 29 points, while Joakim Noah added a double-double with 10 points and 13 rebounds. Gary Neal posted 21 points off the bench for the Spurs. With the win, Chicago moved to 29-8 on the season.

MARCH, 2012

Mar. 4, 2012 – Derrick Rose was named Eastern Conference Player of the Week (Feb. 27 – Mar. 4).

Mar. 4, 2012 – Derrick Rose scored 35 points to lead the Bulls to a 96-91 victory over the Philadelphia 76ers. The two teams were tied after three quarters, but Chicago outscored Philadelphia 32-27 in the fourth quarter to seal the win. Joakim Noah poured in 11 points and grabbed 18 rebounds, while Carlos Boozer added 13 points and seven rebounds for Chicago.

Mar. 5, 2012 – Chicago defeated Indiana 92-72 in their second meeting of the season. Chicago's bench outscored Indiana's 46-28, behind a 13-point performance from John Lucas. As a team, the Bulls held the Pacers to .342 shooting from the floor and .188 from the three-point line.

Mar. 7, 2012 – Chicago completed the season sweep of Milwaukee with a 106-104 victory at the Bradley Center. Derrick Rose led the way for Chicago with 30 points and 11 assists, while Joakim Noah added 20 points and 10 boards. Rose sealed the win for the Bulls by hitting the game winning shot at the end of regulation.

MARCH, 2012 (CONT.)

Mar. 12, 2012 – Derrick Rose scored 32 points and dished out seven assists in Chicago's 104-99 win over the Knicks at the United Center. As a team, Chicago outrebounded New York 56-38 (grabbing 22 offensive rebounds) and outscored the Knicks 50-42 in the paint. Taj Gibson was a big spark off the bench for the Bulls, posting a double-double with 15 points and 13 rebounds.

Mar. 14, 2012 – Signed Mike James.

Mar. 14, 2012 – Chicago won its third game in a row by knocking off the Heat 106-102 at the United Center. John Lucas carried the Bulls off the bench by scoring 24 points in 26:52 of action. Chicago's bench outscored Miami's 56-15. LeBron James (35 points) and Dwyane Wade (36 points) combined for 71 of the Heat's 102 points.

Mar. 19, 2012 – Chicago won its fifth road game in a row by defeating the Magic 85-59. The Bulls held the Magic to 26 second half points (an opponent season-low) and .353 shooting from the field. Carlos Boozer led the way for Chicago posting 24 points and grabbing 13 rebounds, while John Lucas added 20 points off the bench for Chicago. Orlando's 59 points on the night was a Bulls franchise record-low for points allowed in a game.

Mar. 24, 2012 – Luol Deng posted a double-double with 23 points and 10 rebounds to help the Bulls defeat the Raptors in overtime, 102-101. Deng hit the game winning putback layup with :001 left in overtime to seal the victory. Carlos Boozer also tallied a double-double with 24 points and 10 rebounds, while C.J. Watson added 23 points for the Bulls.

Mar. 30, 2012 – The Bulls captured their 42nd win of the season with a 83-71 win over the Detroit Pistons. Chicago outrebounded Detroit 53-37, as four starters posted double figures in scoring. Luol Deng led the way for the Bulls with 20 points and nine rebounds, while Joakim Noah notched a double-double with 19 points and 12 rebounds.

APRIL, 2012

Apr. 2, 2012 – Head Coach Tom Thibodeau was named Eastern Conference Coach of the Month for March.

Apr. 5, 2012 – Signed Mike James.

Apr. 5, 2012 – Chicago won the season series over Boston (3-1), with a 93-86 win over the Celtics at the United Center. Luol Deng led all scorers with 26 points, to go along with his six rebounds. The Bulls outscored the Celtics 55-37 in the second half and outrebounded them 44-36. Joakim Noah added 17 points and nine rebounds in 34:15 of action.

Apr. 10, 2012 – Richard Hamilton recorded 20 points, five assists and four rebounds in 20:35 of action to help Chicago defeat New York, 98-86. With the win, the Bulls won the season series over the Knicks 3-1 and captured their 44th win of the season. Luol Deng added 19 points and 10 rebounds, while Kyle Korver posted 14 points off the bench.

Apr. 12, 2012 – C.J. Watson hit a three-pointer with :022 seconds remaining in regulation to force overtime against the Miami Heat. In overtime, Chicago outscored Miami 12-2 and went on to beat the Heat 96-86. Carlos Boozer posted 19 points and 11 rebounds, while the Bulls bench outscored the Heat's bench 47-7. Luol Deng added 16 points and five rebounds for Chicago.



APRIL, 2012 (CONT.)

Apr. 18, 2012 – Chicago defeated Charlotte 100-68 and captured its 22nd road win of the season. Richard Hamilton had a big game, posting 22 points and six assists, while Omer Asik tallied nine points and 15 rebounds off the bench. The Bulls outbounded the Bobcats 57-38 and held them to nine fourth quarter points.

Apr. 21, 2012 – Luol Deng posted 22 points and six rebounds to lead Chicago to victory over the Dallas Mavericks at the United Center. The win marked the Bulls 25th home win of the season and pushed their record against Western Conference teams to 12-6 on the year. Richard Hamilton added 19 points for Chicago, while Joakim Noah grabbed a team high 14 rebounds.

Apr. 25, 2012 – The Bulls won their final road game of the year with a 92-87 victory over the Indiana Pacers. Kyle Korver posted a big game off the bench posting 20 points in 21:48 of action. Chicago dished out 27 assists and outbounded Indiana 44-34. Joakim Noah added a double-double with 14 points and 14 rebounds, while Taj Gibson tallied 10 points off the bench.

Apr. 26, 2012 – Chicago capped off its regular season finale with a 107-75 win over the Cavaliers. Five Bulls players posted 10 or more points, led by John Lucas' 25 points and Joakim Noah's 13 points and 12 rebounds. The victory marked Chicago's third straight win. Chicago finished the season with the league's best record (50-16) and the No. 1 seed in the Eastern Conference for the second straight season.

Apr. 28, 2012 – As the 2012 Playoffs began, the Bulls hosted the No. 8 seed Philadelphia 76ers in the first round. Chicago led 53-42 after the first half and never looked back. The Bulls cruised to a 103-91 Game 1 victory, behind a 23 point, nine assists and nine rebound performance from Derrick Rose. Richard Hamilton also had a big game scoring 13 of his 19 points in the first half, while Joakim Noah posted a double-double with 12 points and 13 rebounds. Elton Brand led the 76ers with 19 points and seven rebounds.

MAY, 2012

May 1, 2012 – The Bulls led 55-47 after the first half in Game 2, but came out sluggish to start the third quarter. Philadelphia outscored Chicago 36-14 in the third quarter and went on to win Game 2, 109-92. Jrue Holiday scored a game-high 26 points for the 76ers, while Louis Williams posted 20 points and six assists off the bench for Philly. Joakim Noah led the way for Chicago, tallying 21 points, eight rebounds and five assists.

MAY, 2012 (CONT.)

May 4, 2012 – Chicago took a 60-51 lead into the fourth quarter of Game 3, but got outscored 28-14 by Philly in the final quarter. Spencer Hawes posted 21 points and nine rebounds to help Philly win 79-74. Carlos Boozer led the way for Chicago with 18 points and 10 rebounds, while Jrue Holiday had another big game for the 76ers with 17 points, six rebounds and six assists.

May 6, 2012 – Looking to even the series at two games apiece, Chicago came out slow in Game 4 trailing by nine points after the first quarter. The Bulls cut the lead to one point at the end of the third quarter, but eventually fell short 89-82. Both Carlos Boozer (23 points and 11 rebounds) and Taj Gibson (14 points and 12 rebounds) recorded double-doubles for the Bulls. Spencer Hawes again led the way for Philly with 22 points and eight rebounds, while Jrue Holiday posted 20 points, eight rebounds and six assists.

May 8, 2012 – Luol Deng's 24 points and eight rebounds helped lead Chicago to a 77-69 Game 5 victory at the United Center. Both teams got out to slow starts, only tallying a combined 61 first half points (35-26). Chicago held Philly to .321 from the field and 182 from beyond the arc. Carlos Boozer had another big game recording his third double-double of the series with 19 points and 13 assists.

May 10, 2012 – Chicago looked to extend the series as Game 6 moved back to the Wells Fargo Center in Philadelphia. In this must win game for Chicago, the two teams were tied going into the fourth quarter. The Bulls led by one with :05.9 remaining in regulation. With :02.2 left in the game Andre Iguodala sealed the series for the 76ers hitting two free throws and giving Philly the win, 79-78. Luol Deng recorded 19 points and 17 rebounds, while Taj Gibson had 14 points and five boards off the bench, as Chicago was eliminated from the playoffs.

May 23, 2012 – The NBA announced Luol Deng as a selection to the 2011-12 NBA All-Defensive Second Team.

NOTE

The Chicago Bulls led the NBA in home attendance with an average of 22,161 fans per game. During the 2011-12 campaign, the Bulls ranked first in the league in attendance, as they sold out every game at the United Center. Chicago has now recorded 86 sellouts in a row.
