CAVS QUICK FACTS

- The Cleveland Cavaliers will open their **44th NBA regular season tonight** against the Brooklyn Nets at Quicken Loans Arena.
- In last year's season opener, a 94-84 victory over Washington, Anderson Varejao had a record-setting night after finishing with career highs of 23 rebounds (12 offensive) and nine assists to go along with nine points in 37 minutes. **He joined Wilt Chamberlain (11 points, 30 rebounds and nine assists on Oct. 18, 1967) as the only players in NBA history to record at least nine points, 23 rebounds and nine assists in a team's first game of a regular season.**
- Tristan Thompson, who recorded a **team-high 31 double-doubles during the 2012-13 regular season**, posted two double-doubles in the 2013 Preseason. He led the team with 9.1 rebounds (3.9 offensive) to go along with 12.5 points on .521 shooting in only 25.5 minutes per game over eight preseason contests.
- 2013 NBA All-Star Kyrie Irving averaged team highs of 22.5 points and 5.9 assists last season. **Irving, Grant Hill, Magic Johnson and Oscar Robertson are the only players in NBA history to average at least 18 points and five assists while shooting at least 45 percent from the field in each of their first two seasons (ESPN).** In the Cavs' final preseason game on Oct. 24 at Charlotte, Irving netted 20 points and five rebounds in 27 minutes of action.
- Anderson Varejao appeared in 25 games in 2012-13 and **set career highs in points per game (14.1), rebounds per game (14.4), assists per game (3.4), steals per game (1.5) and double-doubles (16).** In the Nov. 13 meeting against Brooklyn last season, he posted a career-best 35 points on 16-21 (.762) shooting, 18 rebounds, three assists and two steals in 37 minutes. He became the first Cavs player to put up those numbers in a single game.
- C.J. Miles led the Cavs with a **career-best 126 three-pointers made in 2012-13, including a franchise record tying 8-10 (.800) shots from behind the three-point line against the Brooklyn Nets on Dec. 29.** Miles, who came off the bench and scored a season-high 33 points that night, became the **first player in Cavaliers history to make eight triples off the bench.**
- This past summer, the Cavs were well-represented internationally as **Tristan Thompson played for Team Canada** in the FIBAS Americas tournament in Caracas, Venezuela. **Sergey Karasev was in action for Russia's National Team**, including winning a Gold Medal at the World University Games in Kazan. Cleveland also had three players (**Kyrie Irving, Dion Waiters and Tyler Zeller**) participate in the **2013 USA Men's National Team Mini-Camp** in July.

CAVALIERS 95, NETS 113 – QUICKEN LOANS ARENA – CLEVELAND, OH (4/3/13)

KEY PERFORMERS: Marreese Speights recorded his fifth double-double of the season (third with the Cavaliers) with 16 points on 7-13 (.538) shooting from the field and 10 rebounds in 22 minutes off the bench...Kyrie Irving finished with 16 points, six assists, one steal and one block in 28 minutes...Tyler Zeller tallied 14 points on 5-9 (.556) shooting from the field and four rebounds in 26 minutes...C.J. Miles recorded 11 points on 3-4 (.750) shooting, three rebounds and one steal in 13 minutes off the bench...MarShon Brooks recorded a career-high 27 points on 12-16 (.750) shooting from the field, four rebounds and a career-high tying seven assists in 37 minutes...Deron Williams tallied 24 points on 8-14 (.571) shooting from the field and eight assists in 27 minutes.

TURNING POINT: The Nets outscored the Cavaliers 38-16 in the second quarter, and extended their lead to 30 heading into halftime.

CAVS HIGHLIGHTS: Cleveland's bench scored at least 30 points for the 24th time since January 25th ...The Cavs shot 23-26 (.885) from the foul line... Cleveland pulled down 13 offensive rebounds, marking the 56th time this season the Cavs have grabbed at least 10 offensive boards. Defensively, the Cavaliers forced 19 turnovers...Tristan Thompson tallied a near double-double with eight points and eight rebounds in 27 minutes.

CAVALIERS 100, NETS 103 – BARCLAYS CENTER – BROOKLYN, NY (12/29/12)

KEY PERFORMERS: C.J. Miles made a franchise record-tying 8-10 (.800) shots from behind the three-point line and finished with a season-high 33 points on 11-15 (.733) shooting in 34 minutes... Tristan Thompson notched his 10th double-double of the season with a season-high 17 points, a season-high tying 15 rebounds (nine offensive) and two blocks in 36 minutes... Kyrie Irving tallied 13 points, four rebounds, a team-high seven assists and one steal in 35 minutes... Tyler Zeller added 12 points and seven rebounds (four offensive) in 27 minutes... Brook Lopez led the Nets with season highs of 35 points and 11 rebounds in 36 minutes... Deron Williams had 15 points and seven assists in 40 minutes... Joe Johnson added 15 points and three steals in 41 minutes.

TURNING POINT: A 13-3 run early in the fourth quarter gave the Nets enough of a lead to withhold a late charge by the Cavs down the stretch.

CAVS HIGHLIGHTS: The Cavs had a season-high 43 points off the bench... Cleveland shot 9-20 (.450) from long range... Alonzo Gee added 10 points, four rebounds and three steals in 32 minutes... Luke Walton dished out a season-high six assists, while adding four points and four rebounds in a season-high 30 minutes... Dion Waiters had a game-high tying three steals and added five points and four assists in 32 minutes.

CAVALIERS 101, NETS 114 – BARCLAYS CENTER – BROOKLYN, NY (11/13/12)

KEY PERFORMERS: Anderson Varejao notched his fourth double-double of the season after setting career highs in points (35) and field goals made (16) to go along with 18 boards (11 offensive), three assists and two steals in 37 minutes... Varejao scored 17 points in the first quarter, which is his highest total in an NBA quarter... Kyrie Irving also set a then career-high with 34 points, while adding four rebounds, a team-high eight assists and three steals in 38 minutes... Irving also shot a perfect 14-14 (1.000) from the free throw line... Irving and Varejao are the first pair of Cavs to score at least 30 points in the same game since March 12, 2009 (LeBron James - 34, Mo Williams - 30)... Tristan Thompson scored in double figures for the fourth straight game after tallying a season-high 14 points on 6-11 (.545) shooting, five rebounds and one steal in 31 minutes... For the Nets, Deron Williams recorded a double-double with 26 points and a game-high 10 assists in 36 minutes... Joe Johnson had 25 points and six assists in 39 minutes... Brook Lopez added 23 points, seven rebounds and four blocks in 29 minutes.

TURNING POINT: The Cavs' 30-29 lead at the end of the first quarter slipped away after the Nets outscored Cleveland 35-12 in the second period.

CAVS HIGHLIGHTS: The Cavs grabbed 16 offensive rebounds which led to a 25-12 advantage in second chance points... Cleveland also had a season-high 64 points in the paint, their most since scoring 66 points inside against the Nets on March 19, 2012.

CAVALIERS 98, BOBCATS 105 – TIME WARNER CABLE ARENA – CHARLOTTE, NC (4/17/13)

KEY PERFORMERS: Kyrie Irving recorded his 4th double-double of the season with 24 points, four rebounds and a game-high 10 assists in 36 minutes... Dion Waiters tallied 14 of his 16 points in the fourth quarter and added three assists and one steal in 22 minutes off the bench... Wayne Ellington shot 5-6 (.833) from the field and scored 13 points in 18 minutes... Alonzo Gee also posted 13 points on 5-9 (.556) shooting from the field in 28 minutes... The Bobcats were led by Kemba Walker's 24 points, four rebounds and seven assists in 36 minutes... Josh McRoberts tallied 20 points on 6-6 shooting from the field and eight rebounds in 41 minutes.

TURNING POINT: The Cavs took a 77-76 lead in the fourth quarter after trailing by as many as 24 earlier in the game... However, Charlotte would go on a 7-0 run and lead the rest of the way.

CAVS HIGHLIGHTS: Cleveland had 24 assists to 12 turnovers... Cleveland also had a 50-38 advantage in points in the paint... Tristan Thompson had a near double-double with eight points and a game-high 10 rebounds in 37 minutes.

CAVALIERS 122, BOBCATS 95 – QUICKEN LOANS ARENA – CLEVELAND, OH (2/6/13)

KEY PERFORMERS: Kyrie Irving finished with 22 points, including shooting a perfect 5-5 from beyond the arc, four rebounds and three assists in 28 minutes... Tristan Thompson had a near double-double with 17 points on 7-8 (.875) shooting from the field, nine rebounds, three assists and a season-high tying three blocks in 24 minutes...

Marreese Speights recorded his second straight double-double as a Cavalier with 11 points and 10 rebounds in 19 minutes off the bench... Dion Waiters tallied 19 points on 9-14 (.642) shooting and five assists in 24 minutes... Wayne Ellington added 16 points on 7-12 (.583) shooting, five rebounds and three assists in 23 minutes off the bench... The Bobcats were led by Byron Mullens, who had 15 points and seven rebounds in 18 minutes.

TURNING POINT: The Cavaliers got off to a hot start, scoring 65 first-half points, which was a season-high for points in a half... They went into halftime with a 24-point lead (65-41)... The last time Cleveland led by at least 24 points at halftime was on March 1, 2010 when the Cavaliers went into the second half leading by 26 (74-48), in a 124-93 win against the New York Knicks.

CAVS HIGHLIGHTS: Cleveland's 27-point victory was its largest regular season margin of victory since March 1, 2010 when Cleveland won by 31 points in a 124-93 win over the New York Knicks... The Cavs had a season-high 33 assists and a season-low six turnovers... The last time the Cavaliers turned the ball over only six times was on April 11, 2011 against Detroit... The Cavs also scored a season-high 122 points on a season-high .565 from the field and held a 50-30 advantage in points in the paint.

CAVALIERS 106, BOBCATS 104 – TIME WARNER CABLE ARENA – CHARLOTTE, NC (1/4/13)

KEY PERFORMERS: Kyrie Irving scored 16 points in the final period, including the game-winning jump shot with one second remaining... Irving finished with a game-high 33 points, including shooting 10-10 from the free throw line, five rebounds, six assists, a career-high tying four steals and a career-high three blocks in 38 minutes... It marked only the second time since 1985-86 that a Cavs player tallied at least 33 points, five rebounds, six assists, four steals and three blocks in a game (LeBron James, 1/9/09 vs. Boston)... Tristan Thompson recorded his 11th double-double of the season with a season-high 19 points on 8-10 (.800) shooting and a game-high 13 rebounds in 37 minutes... C.J. Miles added 18 points on 7-14 (.500) shooting, including 4-9 (.444) from deep, three rebounds and two steals in 39 minutes... Ben Gordon led the Bobcats with 27 points and four assists in 28 minutes off the bench... Ramon Sessions had 20 points, five rebounds and six assists, while shooting 12-12 from the foul line in 35 minutes off the bench.

TURNING POINT: With the game knotted at 104, Kyrie Irving nailed a 12-foot jumper with 1.0 second remaining to seal the win... It marked his fourth career game-winning shot... Cleveland was a perfect 8-for-8 from the free-throw line in the fourth quarter.

CAVS HIGHLIGHTS: The Cavs had a season-high 10 blocks while swiping nine steals... Cleveland connected on at least .500 of their field goal attempts for the second time this season... 62 of the Cavs' 106 points came in the first half (tied season-high for points in a half)... It marked the 12th time the Cavs reached the century mark this season.

Cavs guard Dion Waiters and Bobcats forward James Southerland are both products of Syracuse University.

TRISTAN'S TAKEOVER: Tristan Thompson averaged a near double-double in 2012-13 with career highs of **11.7 points and 9.4 rebounds in 31.3 minutes per game**. His play improved over the last 56 games of the season, as he totaled 26 double-doubles and averaged 13.2 points and 10.3 rebounds in 32.2 minutes per game during that stretch. Prior to that, he recorded five double-doubles and averaged 8.3 points on .466 shooting and 7.6 rebounds in 29.2 minutes through his first 26 games of the year. On the right is a closer look at how Thompson's numbers have increased in 2012-13:

- Thompson's **31 total double-doubles on the year** were tied for the 11th most all-time in franchise history for double-doubles in a single season. Only eight other players in Cavs history have recorded 30 double-doubles in a single season (B. Daugherty, A. Miller, C. Boozer, S. Kemp, D. Gooden, T. Hill, Z. Ilgauskas and L. James).
- His 31 double-doubles ranked 7th in the Eastern Conference.
- On the year, Thompson also averaged **3.7 offensive rebounds per game, which ranked 5th in the league**.
- He set the **Cavaliers franchise record for most offensive rebounds in a single season with 306**, surpassing Zydrunas Ilgauskas' 299 offensive rebounds in the 2004-05 season.
- He grabbed at least four offensive rebounds in 42 games with his 306 offensive rebounds ranking 2nd in the NBA this season.
- **With 773 total rebounds on the year, he passed Tyrone Hill (765) for 10th-most in a single season.**

SWERVING IRVING: Kyrie Irving had a strong 2012-13 campaign, making his first All-Star appearance and averaging 22.5 points, including a .391 mark from deep, 5.9 assists, 3.7 rebounds and 1.5 steals in 34.7 minutes over 59 contests (all starts). Below are other notables on Irving's season:

- **He joined Lenny Wilkens (20.5 points, 8.4 assists, .828 FT% in 1972-73) as the only Cavs players to average at least 20.0 points and 5.0 assists, while shooting .800 or better from the foul line in a single season.** Irving was the only player in the East to put up those numbers in 2012-13.
- Irving became the fourth No. 1 overall pick in NBA history to average at least 20 points and five assists through a player's first two seasons (Oscar Robertson, Allen Iverson and LeBron James). (STATS, Inc.)
- **His 22.5 points per game were the highest for any player age 22 or younger this past NBA season.**
- Irving won the Eastern Conference Player of the Week (Jan. 21-27) after scoring at least 30 points in three straight games (40 vs. BOS on 1/22, 35 vs. MIL on 1/25 and 32 at TOR on 1/26) to become only the **fifth player in NBA history to register three straight 30-point games before his 21st birthday** (John Drew, Bernard King, LeBron James and Kevin Durant).

- He scored at least 20 points 37 times, at least 30 points 13 times and at least 40 points twice this past season.
- After scoring a game-high 40 points on 16-24 (.667) shooting from the field in 38 minutes in a 95-90 win over the Boston Celtics on Jan. 22. Irving became the **youngest player to ever score 40 points in a game against the Celtics**. (20 years, 305 days old, Irving, *Elias*)
- On Dec. 15 against the New York Knicks, Irving scored 17 of the Cavs final 22 points en route to a career-high 41 points on 15-25 (.600) shooting from field. At age 20, he became the **youngest player to score 40 or more points in an NBA game at the current Madison Square Garden** (opened in 1968). He broke the record held by Michael Jordan, who was 21 when he scored 42 points in New York on January 5, 1985. Rick Barry was the youngest with a 40-point game at the old MSG after he scored 57 points there for the San Francisco Warriors in 1965 at age 21.
- He became the **9th player in NBA history under the age of 21 to surpass 2,000 points for his career** on March 4 vs. the Knicks.
- Irving finished 2012-13 averaging **6.8 points in the fourth quarter, which ranked 4th in the NBA**. In the final three minutes of the final quarter, Irving averaged an NBA-high 3.5 points. He scored at least 10 points in 16 fourth quarters this year.

IRON MEN: Alonzo Gee and Tristan Thompson both started in all 82 games for the Cavaliers this past season, becoming the **first pair of Cavs players to start in every game since Andre Miller and Clarence Weatherspoon did in 2000-01**. The only other team to have two players start in every game in 2012-13 was Houston (Omer Asik, Jeremy Lin).

C.J.'S WAY: C.J. Miles led the team with a **career-best 126 three-pointers** made in 2012-13, including a franchise record tying 8-10 (.800) shots from behind the three-point line against the Brooklyn Nets on Dec. 29. Miles, who came off the bench and scored a season-high 33 points that night, became the **first player in Cavaliers history to make eight triples off the bench**.

WORTH THE WAITERS: Dion Waiters was selected to the **2012-13 NBA All-Rookie First Team** after averaging 14.7 points, 2.4 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 1.0 steal in 28.8 minutes per game through 61 appearances (48 starts). His best month came in February when he was named the Kia NBA Eastern Conference Rookie of the Month. During that month, he ranked first in scoring (15.8) and assists (3.1), second in steals (1.1) and field goal percentage (.514) and third in minutes (28.2) among Eastern Conference rookies (minimum 10 games played). He shot at least .500 from the field seven times, including .600 from the field six times in February. Below are a few notes on the Cavs' rookie campaign:

- **Among East rookies, Waiters ranked 1st in points per game (14.7) and FTM (159), 2nd in assists per game (3.0) and 3rd in steals per game (1.0).**
- He scored in double figures in 45 games this season, including 14 games of 20 points or more.
- Waiters made at least one three-pointer in each of his first 13 games of his career (10/30/12–11/24/12) and is **one of three players in NBA history to have started their careers with 10-or-more consecutive games with a three-point field goal** (Damian Lillard, Rudy Fernandez).
- Against the Kings on Jan. 14, Waiters finished with a career-high 33 points on 12-18 (.667) shooting in 29 minutes off the bench. He became just the **third rookie in Cavaliers history to score at least 30 points off the bench**, joining Mike Mitchell (32 on Jan. 6, 1979) and Derek Anderson (30 on April 3, 1998). The last NBA rookie to score 30 points off the bench was Roddy Beaubois (40 on March 27, 2010). (*Elias*)
- In a 108-101 victory over the Los Angeles Clippers on Nov. 5 at the Staples Center, he nailed 7-of-11 (.636) shots from behind the three-point line and finished with 28 points in 32 minutes. Waiters, who was playing in his fourth career game, is the **first player in NBA history to have seven or more three-pointers in one of his first six games**. He is also the first Cavs rookie to make seven three-pointers in a game.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE MACHINE: Anderson Varejao posted 16 double-doubles in 25 contests in 2012-13, including in a career-high 10 straight games with a double-double from Nov. 18 – Dec. 5. He became the **3rd player in Cavs history to post 10 straight double-doubles in a single season**, joining Kenny Carr (10 straight in 1980-81) and Elmore Smith (11 straight in 1977-78). Here are a few more notes on Varejao's 2012-13 season:

- In 25 games, he **averaged career-highs with 14.1 points, 14.4 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 1.5 steals in 36.0 minutes per game.**
- Prior to Dec. 19, Varejao led all qualifying NBA players in rebounds per game (14.4), offensive rebounds per game (5.5) and defensive rebounds per game (8.9) and was tied for 2nd in double-doubles (16).
- **Varejao scored at least 10 points and grabbed 15 or more rebounds, including five or more off the offensive glass, in 10 straight games from Nov. 18 – Dec. 5.** The only other NBA player to score 10 points and grab at least 15 rebounds with five offensive boards in 10 straight games (since the league began recording offensive rebounds in the 1973-74 season) was Moses Malone, who had a 12-game streak for the 1978-79 Rockets.
- He is the **first Cavs player in franchise history to have 10 straight games of at least 15 rebounds (Nov. 18 – Dec. 5).**
- On the season, Varejao had 15 games of 15 rebounds-or-more and two games of at least 20 rebounds-or-more.

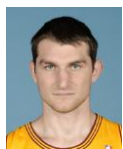
