CAVS QUICK FACTS

- The Cleveland Cavaliers are in Orlando tonight to face the Magic for the second time this season. **The Wine and Gold took the first meeting, 117-103, on Nov. 23 at The Q where Kevin Love had his highest scoring game as a Cavalier with 34 points on 11-18 (.611) shooting, including 6-9 (.667) from the three-point line, eight rebounds, four assists and one block in 34 minutes.** LeBron James posted a double-double (15 points, a game-high 13 assists and six rebounds) and J.R. Smith tallied a season-high 26 points on 10-16 (.625) shooting, including a 6-10 (.600) clip from deep, two assists and one steal in 38 minutes.
- The Wine and Gold have won 11 straight games over the Magic, their longest current winning streak over an opponent.
- In their 11 straight wins over Orlando, the Cavs have outscored the Magic by an average of 14.1 points (108.0 to 93.9), while dishing out 24.9 assists to only 11.5 turnovers during that stretch. In the Nov. 23rd win over the Magic, the Cavs scored 117 points on 43-81 (.531) shooting from the field, while dishing out a season-high 34 assists to just 10 turnovers. The Wine and Gold also knocked down a season-high 18-35 (.514) shots from three-point range, just one triple shy of tying their franchise record (19). Kevin Love and J.R. Smith hit six three-pointers apiece, becoming just the second Cavs duo to accomplish that feat in the same game (Dan Majerle, Danny Ferry on 3/5/96 vs. Seattle).
- MILESTONE ALERT: Tristan Thompson needs 5 rebounds to pass Tyrone Hill (2,785) for 10th place in Cavs history. J.R. Smith needs 4 three-pointers to pass Mike Bibby (1,517) for 23rd all-time in NBA history and Anderson Varejao needs 3 blocks to pass Brad Daugherty (397) for 7th place in Cavs history.
- In Tuesday's 105-100 win over Portland, the Cavs overcame an early 18-point deficit (47-29) by outscoring the Trail Blazers 60-31 to go up by 11 points (89-78) with 7:16 remaining in the game. It was Cleveland's largest come-from-behind victory since overcoming a 19-point deficit at Boston on Nov. 14, 2014. This season, the Cavs have now won six games when facing double-digit deficits.
- Cleveland is 6-0 when shooting at least .500 from the field this season and 34-0 when making at least half their shots since March 23, 2014. The Cavs have shot .500 or better in four of their last five games against the Magic, which includes a .592 (45-76) clip in their last visit to the Amway Center, a 123-108 win on March 15, 2015. Cleveland has also shot 36-70 (.514) from three-point range in their last two games against Orlando.
- LeBron James notched his 9th double-double of the season (298th of career) against Portland after finishing with 33 points on 14-24 (.583) shooting, a team-high 10 rebounds, three assists, two steals and a season-high tying three blocks in 40 minutes. James had 14 points in the fourth quarter and continues to lead the NBA in total points (177) and scoring average (8.9) in the final period.
- Over his last six games, James is shooting .900 (45-50) from the foul line and averaging 28.2 points, 9.7 rebounds and 5.5 assists in 39.3 minutes.
- Kevin Love has scored at least 22 points in four of his last five games versus Orlando with averages of 24.4 points, a .438 (14-32) clip from deep, 11.0 rebounds and 3.0 assists in 35.6 minutes over that stretch.
- Against Portland, Matthew Dellavedova, who leads the NBA in assist-to-turnover ratio (3.69), poured in a season-high 17 points on 7-12 (.583) shooting, three rebounds, three assists (one turnover) and one steal in 37 minutes.
- In the fourth quarter, the Cavs are giving up just 22.8 points (3rd in NBA) on .406 shooting from the field (6th), including .291 from beyond the arc (2nd). In the win over Portland, Cleveland held the Trail Blazers to 9-23 (.391) shooting in the final period.

2015-16 GAME RECAPS (CAVS Lead Series 1-0)

CAVALIERS 117, MAGIC 103 – QUICKEN LOANS ARENA – CLEVELAND, OH (11/23/15)

KEY PERFORMERS: Kevin Love poured in his highest scoring game as a Cavalier with 34 points on 11-18 (.611) shooting, including 6-9 (.667) from the three-point line, eight rebounds, four assists and one block in 34 minutes of action...Love scored 20 points in the second quarter, including 17 consecutive points from the 8:10 mark to the 2:50 mark...LeBron James notched his sixth double-double of the season (295th of his career), delivering 15 points on 7-14 (.500) shooting, a game-high 13 assists, six rebounds and one steal in 35 minutes of play...With his fifth assist, James surpassed Norm Nixon (6,386) for 25th all-time for most assists in NBA history...Tristan Thompson chipped in with nine points and a game-high 14 rebounds in 34 minutes...J.R. Smith tallied a season-high 26 points on 10-16 (.625) shooting, including a 6-10 (.600) clip from deep, two assists and one steal in 38 minutes...Matthew Dellavedova posted a season-high 15 points on 5-8 (.625) shooting, including 4-6 (.667) from the three-point arc, nine assists and one steal in 24 minutes...For Orlando, Andrew Nicholson tallied a team-high 18 points on 6-9 (.667) shooting and a team-high eight rebounds in 24 minutes as a reserve...Shabazz Napier added 11 points, three rebounds and a team-high nine assists and one steal in 29 minutes.

TURNING POINT: After Orlando cut Cleveland's lead to 62-60 early in the third quarter, the Cavs erupted on a 27-8 run to go up 21 late in the period.

CAVS HIGHLIGHTS: The Cavs won their 11th straight game over Orlando, their longest current winning streak over an opponent...Offensively, the Cavs scored 117 points on 43-81 (.531) shooting from the field...The Cavs dished out a season-high 34 assists on 43 field made field goals, while having just 10 turnovers...The Wine and Gold knocked down a season-high 18-35 (.514) shots from three-point territory, just one triple shy of tying their franchise record (19)...Both Kevin Love and J.R. Smith hit six three-pointers; the only other time two Cavaliers knocked down six triples in the same game was on March 5, 1996 against Seattle (Dan Majerle 6, Danny Ferry 6).

KEY PERFORMERS: Iman Shumpert notched the second double-double of his career with 15 points and a season-high tying 10 rebounds, while adding three assists in 38 minutes...Tristan Thompson tallied 14 points, five boards and one block in 28 minutes...Matthew Dellavedova dished out a season-high nine assists to go along with seven points in 32 minutes...Joe Harris recorded nine points on 4-8 (.500) shooting from the field and one block in 25 minutes...Timofey Mozgov had a near double-double with nine points, eight rebounds and one block in 23 minutes...Isaiah Thomas led the Celtics with team highs of 17 points and six assists in 22 minutes off the bench...Evan Turner had 15 points, seven rebounds and four steals in 27 minutes.

CAVALIERS 90, CELTICS 99 – QUICKEN LOANS ARENA – CLEVELAND, OH (4/10/15)

KEY PERFORMERS: Kevin Love finished with a game-high tying 19 points on 6-12 (.500) shooting from the field, including 4-8 (.500) from three-point range, six rebounds and four assists in 31 minutes...LeBron James recorded 14 points, seven assists, three rebounds and one steal in 26 minutes of play...Timofey Mozgov tallied 13 points on 6-10 (.600) shooting from the field, two rebounds and one block in 17 minutes...Mike Miller knocked down 3-6 (.500) three-pointers and finished with 11 points, four rebounds and three assists in 23 minutes off the bench...With Miller's first triple of the night, he moved past Glen Rice (1,559) for 18th all-time in career three-point field goals...Matthew Dellavedova got his 12th start of the season and posted nine points on 4-8 (.500) shooting from the field, a season-high tying eight assists, three rebounds and one steal in 41 minutes...Tristan Thompson grabbed a game-high 12 rebounds (four offensive) in 16 minutes off the bench...Marcus Smart led Boston with a game-high tying 19 points on 7-10 (.700) shooting from the field, including 3-5 (.600) from behind the arc and three rebounds in 34 minutes...Tyler Zeller tallied 13 points on 5-9 (.556) shooting from the field, six rebounds and three assists in 18 minutes of action...Evan Turner dished out 13 assists, to go along with six boards and four points in 34 minutes.

TURNING POINT: The Cavs rallied back from a 16-point deficit and cut Boston's lead to 81-80 early in the fourth quarter, but the Celtics responded with a 9-2 run to hold on for the win.

CAVALIERS 110, CELTICS 79 – QUICKEN LOANS ARENA – CLEVELAND, OH (3/3/15)

KEY PERFORMERS: LeBron James (24,508 points) moved past Ray Allen (24,505) for 21st on the NBA's all-time scoring list after tallying a game-high 27 points on 12-23 (.522) shooting from the field, five assists, three rebounds, a game-high three steals and a block in 26 minutes...It was James' 35th straight game of scoring at least 20 points versus the Celtics, his most consecutive 20-plus point games versus any opponent of his career...Kyrie Irving returned to the starting lineup and finished the night with 18 points on 6-10 (.600) shooting from the field, including 2-4 (.500) from behind the arc, five assists, two rebounds and two steals in 26 minutes of play...Kevin Love chipped in with 12 points, a game-high eight rebounds and three assists in 25 minutes...J.R. Smith wrapped up his night with 12 points on 5-9 (.556) shooting from the floor, including 2-4 (.500) from long range, four rebounds and a steal in 23 minutes...Timofey Mozgov contributed 10 points on 5-6 (.833) shooting from the field, six rebounds, three assists and a game-high three blocks in 20 minutes...Tristan Thompson shot a perfect 4-4 from the field and 2-2 from the charity stripe for 10 points to go along with seven boards in 17 minutes off the bench...James Jones finished with 10 points on 3-6 (.500) shooting from the floor, including 2-4 (.500) from long range, a season-high six rebounds, two assists and a steal in 21 minutes...Brandon Bass led the Celtics with a team-high 15 points and five rebounds (all offensive) in 27 minutes...Isaiah Thomas added 11 points, two assists and two rebounds in 20 minutes off the bench.

TURNING POINT: Cleveland outscored Boston 95-53 through three quarters and led by as many as 44 points.

CAVS HIGHLIGHTS: The Cavaliers' 31-point win over Boston tied their largest margin of victory against the Celtics in franchise history (4/12/09)...The win was also the Cavs' 12 straight win at The Q...Cleveland had seven players score in double figures...Offensively, the Cavs dished out 28 assists and posted 110 points on 43-89 (.483) shooting from the field, while also shooting a perfect 14-14 from the free throw line...The last time the Cavs went perfect from the free throw line was Dec. 28, 2012 vs. Atlanta (14-14)...The Cavs also had advantages in points in the paint (48-24), rebounding (52-42) and fast break points (15-4)...At the defensive end, the Wine and Gold held the Celtics to 79 points on an opponent season-low 31-88 (.352) shooting from the field...Boston was also held to just 7-28 (.250) from behind the arc.

COMEBACK KINGS: After overcoming an 18-point deficit to beat the Portland Trail Blazers on Dec. 8., Cleveland has now won **six games when facing double-digit deficits** this season after trailing by: 15 points at PHI (11/2), 15 points vs. NYK (11/4), 10 points at NYK (11/13), 10 points vs. ORL (11/23), 12 points vs. BKN (11/28) and 18 points vs. POR.

LATE GAME DEFENSE: Coming into tonight's contest, Cleveland has held opponents **under 22 points in the fourth quarter in six of the last seven games. On the season, the Cavs are giving up just 22.8 points (3rd in NBA) on .406 shooting (6th), including .291 from beyond the arc (2nd) in the final period.**

DRAINING THREES: On the season, the Cavs are averaging an **Eastern Conference-best 9.9 three-pointers made per game (4th in NBA).**

- **The Edge:** The Wine and Gold are making an Eastern Conference-best 2.5 more threes per game than their opponent (9.9 to 7.4).
- **10 OR MORE:** Cleveland has made at least **10 three-pointers on 10 occasions this season.**
- **LOVE AND SMITH:** Kevin Love (2.3, 14th in NBA) and J.R. Smith (2.2, 20th in NBA) are both connecting on over 2.0 three-pointers per game.

VERSUS THE WEST: Cleveland is **17-2 in its last 19 regular season games against Western Conference opponents (3-1 this season),** winning by an average of 10.7 points vs. the West in that span (109.7-99.0). The Wine and Gold have also won 10 straight regular season games over the West at The Q.

HOME SWEET HOME: Since Jan. 19 of last season, the Cavaliers hold a **30-2 regular season record at Quicken Loans Arena (including 10-1 this season),** winning by double figures in 20 of the 32 games. BLATT NAMED COACH OF THE MONTH: Cavaliers Head Coach David Blatt was named the NBA Eastern Conference Coach of the Month for games played in October and November. It marked the second time Blatt has earned Coach of the Month accolades (March 2015) as he became the **fourth coach in Cavaliers history to win the award more than once**, joining Lenny Wilkens (three times), Mike Fratello (two times) and Mike Brown (five times). It also marked the 13th time in franchise history a coach has won the honor. Blatt led the Cavaliers to the best record in the East during October/November at 13-4 (.765), including a perfect 9-0 at The Q. During that span, the Cavs averaged an Eastern Conference-best 103.1 points and surrendered just 96.5 points, en route to posting the best differential in the conference at +6.6 points per game. Cleveland also led the East in field goal percentage (.461) and three-pointers per game (10.2), while ranking second in defensive rebounds per game (35.9), third in assists per game (24.1) and fourth in total rebounds per game (46.5). **Blatt is the first coach in Cavaliers history to win the award within the first month of a season.**

LOVE-LY START: Kevin Love is **averaging a team-high 11.0 rebounds per game, the 4th-highest mark in the NBA.** He has pulled down at least 10 rebounds 12 times so far and is also averaging 18.2 points and 2.3 assists in 33.5 minutes per game. His **11 double-doubles are tied for 6th in the NBA and his 48 three-pointers rank 16th in the league.**

- **20-10:** Love has six games with at least 20 points and 10 rebounds this season (172 in career).
- **HOME COOKING:** At The Q in 2015-16, Love has six doubles and is averaging 20.4 points and 10.9 rebounds in 34.0 minutes.
- **BIG NIGHT:** In a win over Orlando on Nov. 23, Love poured in a **season-high 34 points on 11-18 (.611) shooting, including 6-9 (.667) from the three-point line, eight rebounds, four assists and one block in 34 minutes. He scored 20 points in the second quarter, including 17 consecutive from the 8:10 mark to the 2:50 mark.** The 34 points scored by Love was his most as a Cavalier.
- **300 Double-Doubles:** Love notched his 300th career double-double with 24 points and 14 rebounds in 44 minutes at Milwaukee on Nov. 14, becoming the 11th active player to accomplish that feat. **Only Dwight Howard has more double-doubles since Love entered the league in 2008-09.**
- **600 3FGM:** Love hit his 600th career three-pointer on Nov. 10 against Utah to become the 20th player 6'10" or taller to reach that mark. Since three-pointers became an official stat in 1979-80, **Love is just one of two players in NBA history with at least 600 career three-point field goals and an average of 10.0 rebounds per game, joining Larry Bird (10.0 rpg/649 3FGM).**
- **RARE TERRITORY:** After a 101-97 win over Indiana on Nov. 8, **Love became the first Cavalier to tally 22 points, 19 rebounds and three blocks since Jan. 11, 2008** when LeBron James had 31 points, 19 rebounds and three blocks vs. Charlotte.

TOTAL IMPACT: LeBron James is having another solid all-around season in 2015-16 with averages of 26.5 points (5th in NBA) on .495 shooting from the field, 7.9 rebounds, 6.4 assists (13th in NBA) and 1.3 steals in 37.1 minutes per game. He is the **only player in the NBA this season to shoot at least .490 from the field and average at least 25.0 points, 6.0 assists and 6.0 rebounds.** He also has nine double-doubles (18th in NBA).

- **RECENT PLAY:** Over his last six games (since Nov. 25), LeBron James is shooting .900 (45-50) from the charity stripe, while averaging 28.2 points, 9.7 rebounds and 5.5 assists in 39.3 minutes per game.
- **20 & 30 POINT GAMES:** James has scored at least 20 points in 17 of the team's 20 games so far, including seven 30-point outings.
- **DOWN THE STRETCH:** In the fourth quarter in 2015-16, James has 177 points (1st in NBA) and is averaging 8.9 points (also 1st in NBA). He has scored at least 10 points in eight fourth quarters so far, which includes a season-high 23 points in the final period on Dec. 4th in New Orleans.
- **TOP 25 ALL-TIME IN POINTS & ASSISTS:** in a 117-103 win over Orlando on Nov. 23, James passed Norm Nixon (6,386) for 25th all-time in assists with his fifth helper on the night. He joined Oscar Robertson as the only players in NBA history to rank in the Top 25 in points and assists. James has also led or tied for the team-lead in points and assists 481 times in his career (eight this season). The only other player in NBA history with more than 400 such games is Oscar Robertson, who had 517 games of that kind over his 14-year career. (*Elias Sports Bureau*)
- **CLIMBING THE SCORING LIST:** James currently has 25,443 career regular season points and is closing in on Alex English (25,613) for 17th all-time in NBA history. He moved into 18th place on Nov. 25 in Toronto after passing Reggie Miller (25,279) with his free throw at the 7:33 mark of the second quarter. Prior to that, James surpassed Jerry West (25,192) for 19th place on the NBA's all-time scoring list with his 10th point of the night, a three-pointer at the 3:06 mark of the first quarter on Nov. 17 in Detroit.
- **9,000 FGs:** In the Nov. 6 win over Philadelphia, LeBron James became the 20th player in league history to make 9,000 career regular season field goals, as well as the 5th active player to do so (Kobe Bryant, Kevin Garnett, Tim Duncan and Dirk Nowitzki) with his dunk at the 7:23 mark of the second quarter. In the very next game (Nov. 8 vs. Indiana), James surpassed Jerry West (9,016) for 19th place on the NBA's all-time field goals made list.
- **25,000 PTS:** In a 107-100 win at Philadelphia on Nov. 2, LeBron James became the 20th player in NBA history to reach 25,000 career regular season points, as well as the youngest to do so (30 years, 307 days) with his alley-oop dunk at the 8:07 mark of the fourth quarter.
- **HONORS FOR JAMES:** James won the Eastern Conference Player of the Week award for Nov. 16-22. His most recent one was the 49th time James has earned Player of the Week accolades in his career, the most in NBA history. It also marked the 30th time James has earned POW honors as a member of the Cavaliers. During that week, James averaged 25.3 points, 8.7 rebounds and 5.7 assists in 36.0 minutes per game, while shooting .571 (28-49) from the field, .600 (6-10) from the three-point line and .875 (14-16) from the free throw line.
- **CLUTCH NIGHT:** In a 90-88 win over Brooklyn on Nov. 28, James made the go-ahead shot with 1.0 second remaining in regulation to give the Cavs the victory. It was James' 35th go-ahead field goals in the final 5 seconds of regulation/OT (regular season & postseason). In the last 20 seasons, only Kobe Bryant (45) had more at that point. (*ESPN Stats & Info*)

THE 25K CLUB: In a 107-100 win at Philadelphia on Nov. 2, LeBron James became the 20th player in NBA history to reach 25,000 career regular season points, as well as the youngest to do so (30 years, 307 days) with his alley-oop dunk at the 8:07 mark of the fourth quarter.

- He became the 6th active player to reach the 25,000-point club, joining Kobe Bryant, Dirk Nowitzki, Tim Duncan, Kevin Garnett and Paul Pierce.
- James reached 25,000 points in his 915th career game. Only three players reached that mark in as few games as he did: Wilt Chamberlain (691 games), Michael Jordan (782), and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (889).
- James recorded 22 points and 11 assists in reaching the plateau, becoming the 6th player to record a double-double in the game in which he surpassed 25,000 points, joining Chamberlain (who had a triple double when he reached that mark in 1968), Jerry West (1973), Abdul-Jabbar (1980), Karl Malone (1997), and Tim Duncan (2014).
- James is just the 7th player to reach the 25,000-point milestone before the end of his 13th season, along with Wilt Chamberlain, Michael Jordan, Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, Karl Malone, Oscar Robertson and Dominique Wilkins.
- Everyone ahead of James on the NBA's all-time scoring list has logged at least 1,000 games except Jerry West with 932.
- With his very first point against the Sixers that night, James became the 11th player with 30,000 points when adding playoff numbers to the overall total. (*Elias Sports Bureau*)

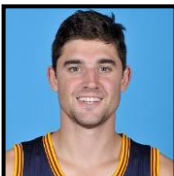
