CAVS QUICK FACTS

- The Cavaliers will open up their two-game road trip tonight at the Air Canada Centre when they face off against the Toronto Raptors. Tonight's contest marks the third and final time these two teams will meet during the 2015-16 regular season. The Cavaliers hold an 11-2 record against the Atlantic Division this season. **Since Dec. 28, the Cavs have the best road record in the NBA at 11-2 (.846).**
- The Wine and Gold have won four of their last five contests against the Raptors.** Over that five-game stretch versus Toronto, the Cavs averaging 110.2 points on .496 shooting, including a .444 clip from the three-point line, 25.8 assists (11.6 turnovers) and 11.2 three-pointers.
- In their last meeting against Toronto, **the Cavaliers won 122-100 at The Q on Jan. 4. Cleveland shot 41-74 (.554) from the field, including 17-33 (.515) from deep, and dished out 25 assists.** The Cavs had six players score in double figures, including all five starters (Irving-25, Smith-24, James-20, Love-14, Thompson-14 and Dellavedova-11). Cleveland also outrebounded the Raptors, 40-26.
- MILESTONE ALERT:** Kevin Love is **5 threes away from tallying his 700th career three-pointer.** He could become the **only player in NBA history to have a career average of at least 10.0 rebounds and connect on 700-plus three-pointers.**
- The Cavaliers are coming off of a 114-103 win over the Charlotte Hornets on Wednesday night at The Q. **The Cavs set a season-high for points in a quarter with 40 points in the second period.** Cleveland scored 22 points off of 14 Charlotte turnovers, making Wednesday's game the 15th time this season the Cavs scored 20 or more points off of turnovers (15-0).
- Against the Hornets Wednesday evening, the Cavs shot 13-32 (.406) from the three-point line. The contest marked the 30th time this season the Cavs drained 10 or more from deep. **Cleveland is averaging 10.1 made triples per game, which is good for 5th-most in the NBA.**
- Wednesday night's game marked the 21st time this season the Cavs dished out 25 or more assists in a game,** as Cleveland recorded 26 assists to nine turnovers. The Wine and Gold have **won 20 straight games when dishing out at least 25 assists (since Oct. 28).**
- The Cavs had a 28-7 advantage in fast break points against the Hornets, which was tied for their 2nd-most transition points in 2015-16 (31 vs. PHI on Dec. 20).
- LeBron James recorded his 45th 20-point game this season after finishing with 23 points on 8-13 (.615) shooting, including 2-4 (.500) shooting from beyond the arc, seven rebounds, a game-high tying seven assists and two steals in 30 minutes against Charlotte. **James has now had at least 20 points, five rebounds and five assists in 25 games this season. The Cavs are also 29-3 when he shoots at least .500 from the field.**
- Over the past 12 games, Kyrie Irving is averaging 24.1 points on .530 shooting, 2.6 rebounds and 5.3 assists in 33.5 minutes.** He has scored at least 20 points in nine of those 12 games, which includes three 30-point outings.
- J.R. Smith contributed 16 points on 6-11 (.545) shooting, including a 2-3 (.667) clip from three, five rebounds, two assists and a game-high three steals in 34 minutes of play against Charlotte. Wednesday night's contest marked Smith's 8th game with three or more steals. Since Jan. 1, 2016, J.R. Smith has hit the 2nd-most three-pointers in the NBA (85).
- Tristan Thompson notched his team-leading 33rd game with double-digit rebounds Wednesday night,** finishing with a game-high 10 rebounds, to go along with six points on 3-6 (.500) shooting from the field and two assists in 23 minutes. Thompson has recorded 10 or more rebounds in seven of the last eight contests. **Over the last eight games, Thompson is averaging 11.0 rebounds, which includes 4.7 offensive boards and 7.0 points on .590 shooting in 33.1 minutes.**
- In his second game as a Cavalier, Channing Frye poured in 15 points on 5-9 (.556) shooting, including 4-8 (.500) from three-point territory, six rebounds and one steal in 18 minutes against Charlotte.

CAVALIERS 122, RAPTORS 100 – QUICKEN LOANS ARENA – CLEVELAND, OH (1/4/16)

KEY PERFORMERS: Kyrie Irving poured in a season-high 25 points on 10-16 (.625) shooting, six rebounds and a team-high eight assists in 29 minutes of action...J.R. Smith made a season-high 8-14 (.571) shots from the three-point line and finished with 24 points and three rebounds in 30 minutes...It was the 14th time in his regular season career he's made at least eight triples in a game...Tristan Thompson recorded his second consecutive double-double and 7th double-double of the season (97th of career) with 14 points on 4-6 (.667) shooting and a game-high 11 rebounds in 31 minutes...LeBron James finished with 20 points on 7-11 (.636) shooting, two rebounds, seven assists and three steals in 31 minutes...Kevin Love had a near double-double with 14 points, nine rebounds, two assists, two steals and three blocks in 33 minutes of play...Matthew Dellavedova added 11 points on 3-4 (.750) shooting, three rebounds and four assists in 25 minutes off the bench...For Toronto, Kyle Lowry tallied a team-high 23 points on 7-13 (.538) shooting, including 3-5 (.600) from deep, four rebounds and a game-high 10 assists in 35 minutes...DeMar DeRozan chipped in 19 points on 8-15 (.533) shooting, two rebounds and four assists in 35 minutes.

TURNING POINT: Cleveland outscored the Raptors 64-44 in the second half. Cleveland shot 21-37 (.568) in the half compared to Toronto's 15-38 (.395) shooting.

CAVALIERS 99, RAPTORS 103 – AIR CANADA CENTRE – TORONTO, ON (11/25/15)

KEY PERFORMERS: LeBron James led the Cavs with a team-high 24 points, an 11-12 (.917) clip from the foul line, six rebounds and a game-high eight assists in 40 minutes...James surpassed Reggie Miller (25,279) for 18th place on the NBA's all-time scoring list with his free throw at the 7:33 mark of the second quarter...Kevin Love posted his 9th double-double of the season with 21 points on 7-14 (.500) shooting, including a 5-8 (.625) mark from the three-point line, a game-high 13 rebounds and two assists in 35 minutes...Tristan Thompson had a near double-double with eight points on 4-8 (.500) shooting, 11 rebounds, two assists, a steal and a block in 37 minutes...J.R. Smith shot 3-5 (.600) from long distance and finished with 15 points, two rebounds, four assists and two steals in 36 minutes...Mo Williams added 15 points on 7-12 (.583) shooting, three rebounds, three assists and one block in 32 minutes off the bench...Kyle Lowry led the Raptors with a game-high 27 points on 11-17 (.647) shooting, six assists and four steals in 38 minutes...DeMar DeRozan tallied 20 points and four assists in 40 minutes...Bismack Biyombo notched a double-double with 11 points and 12 rebounds in 33 minutes.

CAVALIERS 121, WIZARDS 115 – VERIZON CENTER – WASHINGTON, D.C. (1/6/16)

KEY PERFORMERS: LeBron James notched his 300th career double-double (11th of the season) after tallying a game-high 34 points (14 in the 3rd) on 12-22 (.545) shooting, including 4-9 (.444) from the three-point line, a game-high 10 rebounds, four assists, one steal and one block in 40 minutes...Kyrie Irving scored 19 points in the fourth quarter and finished with a season-high 32 points on 14-22 (.636) shooting, five rebounds, three assists, two steals and one block in 34 minutes...J.R. Smith poured in 25 points on 10-16 (.625) shooting, including 5-10 (.500) shooting from behind the arc, three rebounds and three steals in 3 minutes...Kevin Love had a near double-double with eight points, nine rebounds (five offensive), two steals and a block in 29 minutes...Tristan Thompson added 12 points on 4-7 (.571) shooting and three rebounds in 36 minutes...For Washington, John Wall had a double-double with 20 points and a game-high 12 assists in 40 minutes...Garrett Temple tallied a team-high 21 points on 7-10 (.700) shooting from the field and four rebounds in 34 minutes.

TURNING POINT: When the score was knotted at 95-95 with 10:53 remaining in the game, Cleveland went on a 15-2 run and held the lead the rest of the way. Kyrie Irving scored 12 of the Cavs' 15 points during that run. He ended the quarter with 19 points on 8-11 (.727) shooting from the field.

KEY PERFORMERS: LeBron James posted his 8th double-double of the season (297th of career) with a team-high 24 points, a season-high tying 13 rebounds (four offensive), four assists, one block and one steal in 37 minutes of action...James also went a perfect 8-8 (1.000) from the free throw line...Tristan Thompson chipped in with six points and 11 rebounds (three offensive) in 27 minutes off the bench...Matthew Dellavedova notched a season-high tying 15 points on 5-9 (.556) shooting, including a perfect 3-3 (1.000) from deep, two rebounds, two steals and one block in 27 minutes as a reserve...Mo Williams contributed 12 points on 5-10 (.500) shooting, three rebounds and three assists in 28 minutes...With Williams' first made field goal of the night at the 8:41 mark, he tallied his 4,000th regular season career field goal...J.R. Smith registered 13 points, four rebounds, three assists, two steals and one block in 36 minutes...For Washington, John Wall tallied 35 points, four rebounds, 10 assists and five steals in 41 minutes...Bradley Beal recorded 18 points, nine rebounds and six assists in 42 minutes.

HEATING UP: Cleveland has scored at least **110 points in 9 of the last 14 games (11-3)** and are averaging **109.5 points on .484 shooting from the field and 23.7 assists** (12.4 turnovers) since then. Over that stretch (since Jan. 25), the Cavs rank 6th in the NBA in points per game and 5th in field goal percentage.

- Cleveland scored at least **110 points in five straight games from Jan. 25-Feb. 1, the first time doing so since December 15-26, 1992** (seven straight games).
- The Cavs scored 120 points in back-to-back home games from Feb. 8-10, which was the first time accomplishing that feat since Jan. 16-28, 1993 (three straight home contests). (Elias)

SCORING 100 OR MORE: The Cavs are **30-3 this season when scoring 100 points or more**. They have also won **58 of the last 62 regular season games** when topping the century mark dating back to last season.

In a back-to-back set from Jan. 29-30, LeBron James, Kyrie Irving and Kevin Love each topped 20 points, becoming the first Cavs trio to do that on consecutive nights since April 7-8, 1997.
- **114+:** Cleveland scored at least **114 points in four straight games from Jan. 25-30, their first time doing that since Dec. 15-19, 1992** (also four straight games) (Elias Sports Bureau).
- **120+:** The Cavaliers scored at least 120 points in a **franchise-record tying three straight games from Jan. 4-8**. The team has accomplished that feat six times before, with the last coming from March 10-15, 2015.
- **FIRST TIME EVER:** In a 121-115 win at Washington on Jan. 6, LeBron James scored 34 points on 12-22 (.545) shooting from the field, Kyrie Irving made 14 of his 22 (.636) field goal attempts in a 32-point effort and J.R. Smith chipped in with 25 points and converted 10 of his 16 (.625) field goal attempts. **It marked the first time in Cleveland's franchise history that it had three players each score at least 25 points and make more than half of their field goal attempts in a road game**. THE LOVE MACHINE: Kevin Love is averaging a team-high 10.2 rebounds per game, the 9th-highest mark in the NBA. He has pulled down at least 10 rebounds 28 times so far and is also averaging 15.9 points and 2.4 assists in 32.1 minutes per game. His 25 double-doubles are tied for 14th in the NBA, his 111 three-pointers are tied for 19th in the league and his 8.1 defensive rebounds rank 7th in the NBA.

- **20-10:** Love has 10 games with at least 20 points and 10 rebounds this season (176 in career).
- **15-15:** He has seven games with at least 15 points and 15 rebounds this season.
- **ONLY ONE:** Love is the only player in the NBA in 2015-16 to average at least 10.0 rebounds and hit at least 100 three-pointers.
- **HALFTIME ACT:** Love recorded first half double-doubles in consecutive games in wins over Brooklyn on Jan. 20 (14 pts/13 rebs) and the L.A. Clippers on Jan. 21 (11 pts/11 rebs). The last Cleveland player with a first-half double-double in consecutive games was Zydrunas Ilgauskas, who did it in three straight games from Jan. 12-16, 1998. It was the 5th time that Love has had a first half double-double in at least two consecutive games, and first as a member of the Cavaliers. Love did this in three straight games once, in December 2010. (*Elias Sports Bureau*)
- **BIG NIGHT:** In a win over Orlando on Nov. 23, Love poured in a season-high 34 points on 11-18 (.611) shooting, including 6-9 (.667) from the three-point line, eight rebounds, four assists and one block in 34 minutes. He scored 20 points in the second quarter, including 17 consecutive from the 8:10 mark to the 2:50 mark. The 34 points scored by Love was his most as a Cavalier.
- **300 Double-Doubles:** Love notched his 300th career double-double with 24 points and 14 rebounds in 44 minutes at Milwaukee on Nov. 14, becoming the 12th active player to accomplish that feat. Only Dwight Howard has more double-doubles since Love entered the league in 2008-09.
- **600 3FGM:** Love hit his 600th career three-pointer on Nov. 10 against Utah to become the 20th player 6'10" or taller to reach that mark. Since three-pointers became an official stat in 1979-80, Love is one of two players in NBA history with over 600 career three-point field goals and an average of 10.0 rebounds per game, joining Larry Bird (10.0 rpg/649 3FGM).
- **RARE TERRITORY:** After a 101-97 win over Indiana on Nov. 8, Love became the first Cavalier to tally 22 points, 19 rebounds and three blocks since Jan. 11, 2008 when LeBron James had 31 points, 19 rebounds and three blocks vs. Charlotte.

IRON MAN: Tristan Thompson has appeared in all 82 games in each of the past three seasons, as well as every game so far in 2015-16. So far, his consecutive regular season games played streak is at 344 dating back to Feb. 10, 2012, which is the longest active streak in the NBA. He has also put up solid numbers this season, notching 16 double-doubles and averaging 9.6 rebounds (15th in NBA), including a team-high 3.4 offensive rebounds (5th in NBA), to go along with 7.8 points on .580 shooting from the field in 28.2 minutes per game.

KYRIE'S RETURN: In his 30 games back on the floor, Kyrie Irving is averaging 18.9 points, 3.0 rebounds and 4.4 assists in 29.5 minutes per game. He is also shooting .861 from the foul line.

- **POINTS IN BUNCHES:** Irving has scored at least 20 points 15 times so far and at least 30 points four times.
- **GETTING IT DONE LATE:** In the fourth quarter, Irving is averaging 6.8 points (7th-best in NBA).
- **30-10:** Irving had a season-high tying 32 points and a career-high tying 12 assists in a win over Sacramento on Feb. 8, which was his 3rd 30-10 game of his career (11/9/13 & 12/10/13)
- **UNSTOPPABLE IN 4TH AT D.C.:** In a win at Washington on Jan. 6, Kyrie Irving finished with a season-high 32 points on 14-22 (.636) shooting, five rebounds, three assists, two steals and one block in 34 minutes. When the score was knotted at 95-95 with 10:53 remaining in the game, Cleveland went on a 15-2 run and held the lead the rest of the way. Kyrie Irving scored 12 of the Cavs' 15 points during that run. He ended the fourth quarter with 19 points on 8-11 (.727) shooting from the field.

J.R.'S THREE-BALL: Since playing his first game as a Cavalier on Jan. 7, 2015, J.R. Smith has connected on 269 three-pointers (regular season only), which ranks 1st in the Eastern Conference over that span. He is averaging 2.7 three-pointers made per game since wearing a Wine and Gold jersey (98 regular season games).

- **27 PTS IN 19 MIN:** In a victory at Minnesota on Jan. 8, Smith had a season-high 27 points on 10-12 (.833) shooting from the field, including 5-6 (.833) from beyond the arc, and two steals in just 19 minutes. Smith became the first Cavs player to ever finish with at least 27 points in under 20 minutes in franchise history. Before Smith, the last NBA player to accomplish that feat was Kevin Durant who played 19 minutes and scored 30 points Dec. 18, 2014 against Golden State. (*Elias Sports Bureau*)
- **8-BALL:** In a win over Toronto on Jan. 4, Smith made a season-high 8-14 (.571) shots from the three-point line and finished with 24 points and three rebounds in 30 minutes. It was Smith's 14th career regular season game with at least eight three-pointers, the 2nd-most in NBA history, behind only Golden State's Stephen Curry (20 games).

DELLY CARE: Matthew Dellavedova currently ranks 7th in the NBA in assists-to-turnover ratio at 3.01. He currently has 241 assists and 80 turnovers this season. He has had no more than one turnover on 25 occasions. On the season, Dellavedova is averaging career highs in points (8.1), rebounds (2.4), assists (4.8), steals (0.7) and minutes (26.3).

- **DELLY TREY:** Dellavedova is leading the Cavs in three-point percentage, connecting on .431 (6th in NBA) of his attempts from long range.

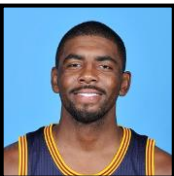
